Subject: In the matter of Determination of Ad-hoc Tariff for Cargo Handling Services for M/s AI Airport Services Limited (AIASL) at Chennai International Airport w.e.f. 10.06.2024 up to 31.03.2025.

Service Provider's submission:

1. M/s AI Airport Services Limited (AIASL), a wholly owned subsidiary of M/s AI Assets Holding Limited (AIAHL), under the Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA), Government of

- India (GOI), is an authorized Ground Handling Agency (GHA) at all the AAI airports in India, performing Passenger, Ramp and Cargo Handling services.
- 2. M/s AIASL, vide letter dated 30.04.2024 submitted that they are providing Cargo Handling services at Chennai International Airport, as per the Airports Authority of India (Ground Handling Services) Regulations, 2018.
- 3. M/s AIASL, further submitted that their company is undergoing the dis-investment process and same is expected to be completed shortly. In view of the AIASL's on-going dis-investment process, Independent Service Provider (ISP) requested the Authority to grant Ad-hoc Tariff for their International Cargo Handling Services at the Chennai International Airport, as an interim measure. M/s AIASL further requested the Authority to allow it to charge the same Tariff for their cargo handling services at Chennai Airport, as has been approved by AERA for M/s AAI Cargo Logistics and Allied Services Company Limited (AAICLAS) for its Cargo Handling Services at Chennai Airport.

Authority's Examination of M/s AIASL submission:

- 4. The Authority notes that AIASL, a Govt. Undertaking under the administrative control of AIAHL, is providing Cargo Handling Services at Chennai Airport, as per the provisions of Airports Authority of India (Ground Handling Services) Regulations, 2018 (F. No. AAI/OPS/707/GHR-2018 dated 26th October, 2018) read with AAI (Ground Handling Services) Amendment Regulations, 2019 & AAI (Ground Handling Services) Amendment Regulations, 2023, for AAI controlled airports.
- 5. The ISP, vide letter no. AIASL/2024-25/HCA/003 (REV) dated 30.04.2024, requested AERA to provide ad-hoc tariff for their Cargo Handling Services at Chennai International Airport, as an interim measure. The Authority notes that M/s AIASL is undergoing disinvestment process and as per the ISP, disinvestment process is likely to be completed shortly. The Authority, taking cognizance of the above submission of M/s AIASL, is of the view that it would be appropriate to consider ad-hoc tariff for the Cargo Service Provider, as an interim arrangement. Subsequently, the Authority will consider determination of regular tariff for the AIASL, once the dis-investment process is completed and new management takes over the operations of the company.
- 6. In the above context, the Authority has examined the preliminary submission of M/s AIASL and observed that the ISP in its proposal for ad-hoc tariff for Chennai International Airport has not submitted tariff rates for cargo services pertaining to Air Freight Station (AFS). Further, it is noted that AIASL has considered Airline Facilitation Charges, which are not part of the approved tariff rates for M/s AAICLAS (based on which, ad-hoc tariff has been sought by the ISP). Besides above, it is also observed that ISP's proposal doesn't have Tariff Rates in respect of Domestic Inbound & Outbound Cargo Handling Services.

Accordingly, clarifications were sought from the ISP on the above points.

7. M/s AIASL, on the above observations of the AERA submitted that their company is presently providing services pertaining to International Export Cargo only. As regard to International Import Cargo & Courier Terminal Handling etc., the ISP informed that request for additional land allotment has been submitted to AAICLAS for further expansion of cargo infrastructure, so as to perform import cargo handling services etc.

Further, AIASL vide email dated 16.05.2024 requested AERA not to consider the Airlines Facilitation Charges proposed in their earlier submission for ad-hoc tariff and requested the Authority to consider approval of ad-hoc tariff for their Chennai Cargo Operations, based on the approved tariffs applicable to AAICLAS, Chennai.

- 8. Based on above clarifications by AIASL, Authority decides to approve ad-hoc tariff for Import Cargo Handling Services, as an enabling provision. The Ad-hoc Tariff for Import Cargo Handling Services shall become effective from the date of commencement of International Import Cargo Handling operations by AIASL at Chennai International Airport.
- 9. The Authority has compared the tariff rates for the international cargo handling services proposed by M/s AIASL with the Tariff Rates approved by AERA for AAICLAS (Chennai), which is the other service provider, rendering cargo handling service at Chennai International Airport. It is observed that the charges proposed (Ad-hoc Tariff) by the ISP are same, as has been approved by the Authority for AAICLAS, Chennai (for FY 2023-24).
- 10. In view of the foregoing, the Authority decides to consider the Ad-hoc Tariff for AIASL in respect of its International Cargo Handling Services at Chennai Airport, based on the prevailing tariff (as on 31-03-2024) applicable to M/s AAICLAS at Chennai airport, as an interim measure, till the regular tariff is determined for the ISP.

Upon careful consideration of the material available on records, the Authority, in exercise of powers conferred by Section 13(1)(a) of the Airports Economic Regulatory Authority of India Act, 2008, hereby orders that:

- (i) AI Airport Services Limited (AIASL), is allowed to levy & collect the Tariff for its International Cargo Terminal Operations (CTO) at Chennai International Airport, Chennai, on ad-hoc basis, as per Annexure-I for the period from 10.06.2024 to 31.03.2025.
- (ii) The Ad-hoc Tariff for Import Cargo Handling Services shall be effective from the date of commencement of International Import Cargo Handling operations by AIASL.

- (iii) Ad-hoc Tariff approved as above shall be the maximum charges to be levied to users. No other charge(s) is to be levied over and above the approved Tariff.
- (iv) The Airport Operator shall ensure compliance of this Order.
- (v) Airport Operator, shall publish Tariff in respect of Cargo Handling Services provided by M/s AIASL at Chennai Airport, approved hereinunder by the Authority, at its official website for the information of all Stakeholders.



- b) 10% discount in the Terminal, Storage and Processing charges will be granted to Exporters, who opt for engaging their own manpower for offloading cargo from their vehicles at Truck Dock and shifting to Custom Examination Area and handing over to Airlines/Terminal Operator, wherever it is applicable.
- c) Consignments of human remains coffin including unaccompanied baggage of deceased and human eyes will be exempted from the purview of Terminal, Storage and Processingcharges & Demurrage charges.
- d) Terminal, Storage and processing charges are inclusive of Forklift charges wherever Forklift usage is involved. No separate Forklift charges will be levied.
- e) Special cargo consists of live animals, hazardous goods and valuable cargo.
- f) Charges will be levied on the 'gross weight' or the 'chargeable weight' of the consignment, whichever is higher. Wherever the 'gross weight' and (or) 'volume weight' is wrongly indicated on the Airway Bill and is found more, charges will be levied on the 'actual gross weight' or 'actual volumetric weight', whichever is higher.
- g) For mis-declaration of weight above 2% and up to 5% of declared weight, penal charges @ double the applicable Terminal, Storage and Processing charges and for variation above 5%, the penal charges @ 5 times the applicable Terminal, Storage and Processing charges will be leviable on the differential weight, subject to minimum amount equivalent to the applicable minimum Terminal, Storage and Processing charges. No penal charges will be leviable for variation up to and inclusive of 2%. (For any variation, all the documents/records to be invariably amended). No weight variation acceptable in the case of VAL consignments.
- h) All Bills shall be rounded off to the nearest of Rupee 1/-.
- i) Valuable cargo consists of gold, bullion, currency notes, securities, shares, share coupons, traveler's cheques, diamonds (including diamonds for industrial use), diamond jewellery, jewellery & watches made of silver, gold platinum and items valued at USD 1000 per Kg. & above.
- j) Terminal Operator shall levy packing/repacking charges @ 2% of packages per shipping bill with a minimum of Rs.20/= per Airway Bill. Packing / Repacking charges will be at Rs.10/= per packet.
- k) XBIS usage charges is Re.1/= per kg subject to minimum of Rs. 150/= per shipment. The same is applicable for ODC shipment where physical check with the help of ETDs are facilitated.
- 1) Charges shall be leviable separately for installation/commissioning/maintenance of air cargo inspection system (ACIS) as stipulated by CBIC, as & when implemented.
- m) For Cargo Logistics/Handling pertaining to Air Freight Station (AFS), 30% lower charges for Terminal, Storage and Processing Charges will be applicable.
- n) All the above charges are excluding GST, which will be charged extra at an applicable rate.
