The Federation of Indian Airlines (FIA), on behalf of its member airlines (*IndiGo, SpiceJet, and Air India*), sincerely appreciates AERA's efforts in engaging stakeholders through the consultation process and the meeting held on 17th February 2025.

As per the Investment Information and Credit Rating Agency of India (ICRA), the aviation industry is projected to report a net loss exceeding INR 3,000 crore in FY25. The sector continues to face significant financial headwinds due to factors such as geo-political instability, supply chain disruptions, rising Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) price, foreign exchange fluctuations, and limited government financial support.

We would like to commend AERA for its proactive approach in rationalising the originally proposed increase in aeronautical charges and for setting these charges below the existing levels. This thoughtful decision reflects AERA's commitment to the long-term sustainability of the aviation sector and its responsiveness to the concerns raised by stakeholders. We recognize that this reduced proposal will provide much-needed relief to airlines and passengers, mitigating the financial pressures that the industry is currently facing.
